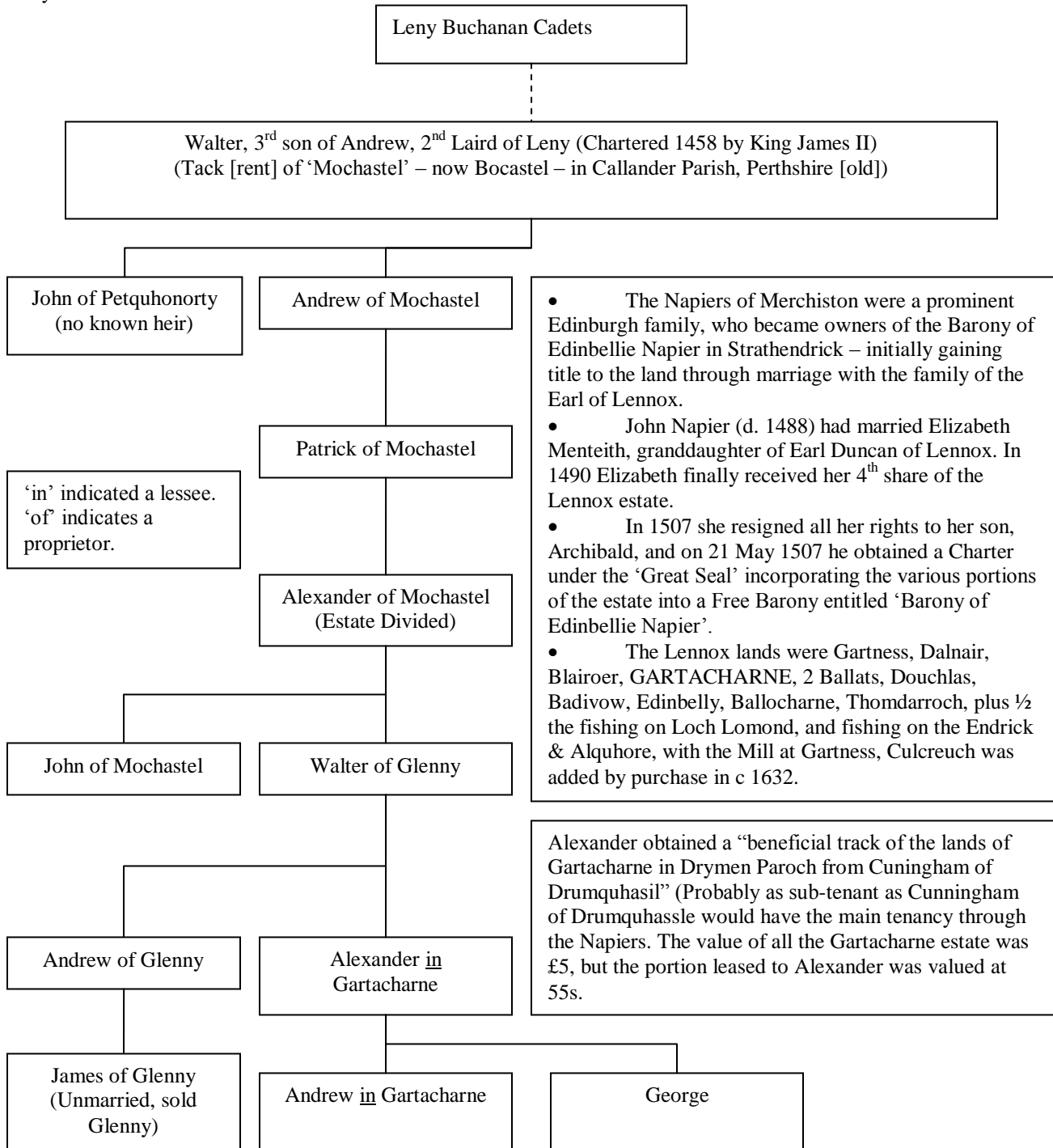


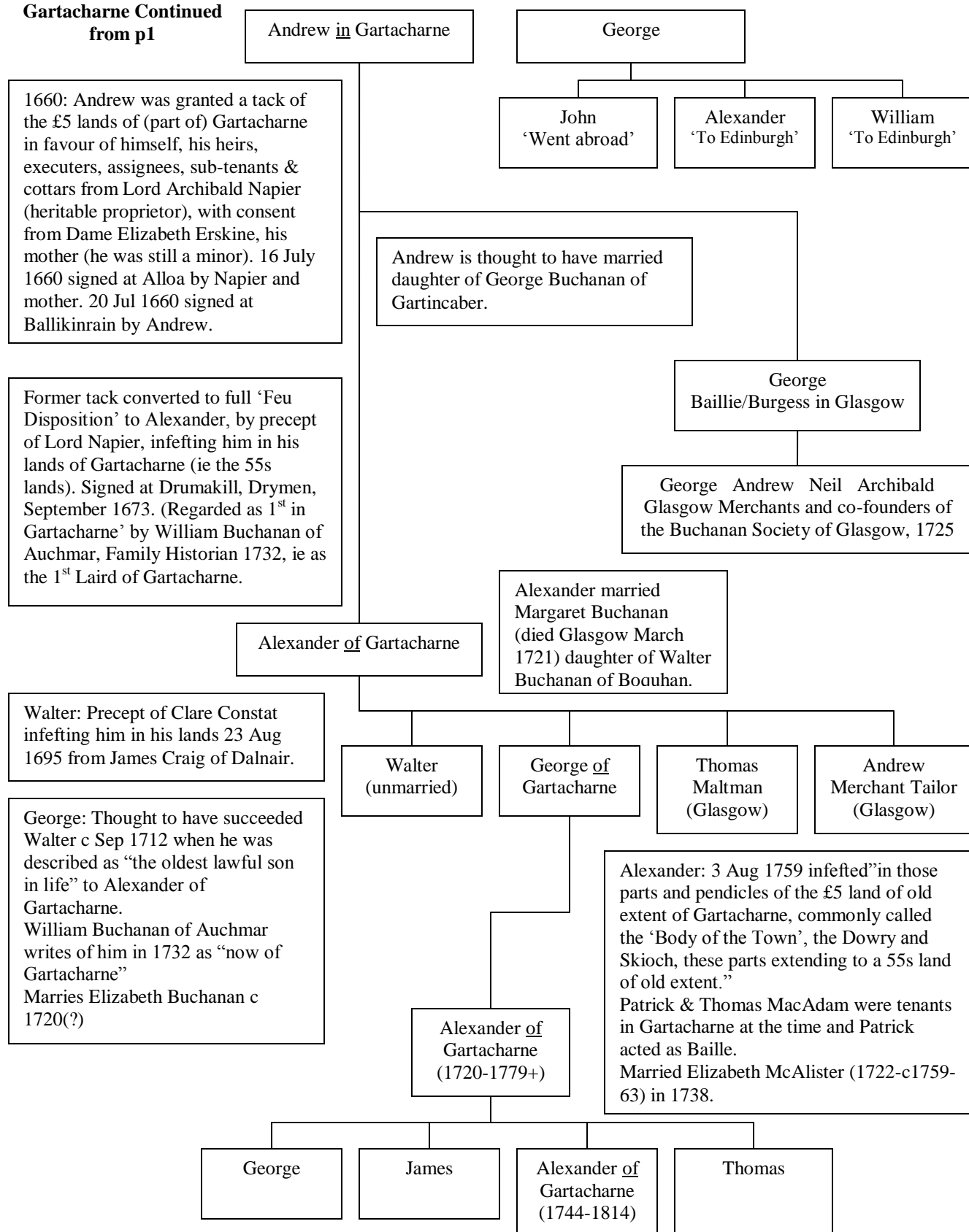
Gartacharne

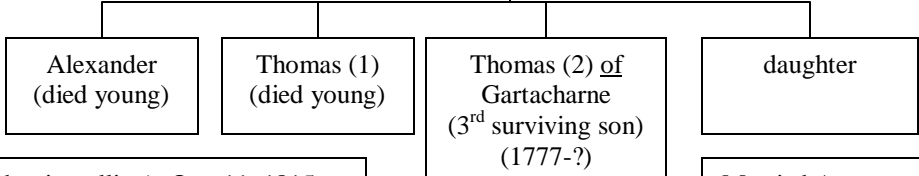

Sasine Abridgement (with misspelling): Aug. 13. 1806.
“Alexander Buchanan, Portioner, Gartocharn, as heir to Alexander Buchanan, Portioner there, his father, seised, Aug 18 1806 – in parts of the £5 land of Gartocharn, called the Body of the Town, the Dowry & Skeoch extending to a 55s land, par, Drymen;-on Par.Cl.Con. by Andrew Millar of Dalnair, Feb 20, 1806.

Sasine Abridgement (with misspelling): Oct. 11. 1815.
“Thomas Buchanan, Portioner, Gartocharn, as heir to Alexander Buchanan, Portioner there, his father, seised, Oct 7 1815 – in parts of the £5 land of Gartocharn, called the Body of the Town, the Dowry & Skeoch extending to a 55s land, par, Drymen;-on Par.Cl.Con. by Alexander Millar of Dalnair, Jul 17, 1815.

Valuation Roll Extracts:
1855-56. Lands of Gartacharne. Proprietor, Alexander Buchanan of Gartacharn, occupier Alexander Buchanan. Value £175. Gartacharn Cottage & Lands, tenant & occupier “Mrs Buchanan.” (probably widowed mother)
1865-66 Lands and farm of Gartacharn. Alexander Buchanan, occupied by self. Shootings: Duke of Montrose (tenant). Cottage & Garden, occ Mrs Buchanan.
1880-81. Gartacharn, Drymen: Farm £182. Alexander Buchanan, farmer. Shootings: William MacAdam (tenant), Cottage & Land, occ. James Urquart.
1914-15. Farm: Gartacharn. Alexander Buchanan, farmer. House & garden occ, James Brown (tenant) Courthouse officer. Shootings: George A. Mitchell, coalmaster, Park of Drumquhassle (tenant).
(By 1938 the owner was a James Davidson – farm, cottage & shootings rights (game birds, rabbits, etc))
